

## Sixth Form Dress Code

### Rationale

All students at Bridgnorth Endowed School are role models and therefore expected to exemplify the highest standards. The way we present ourselves each day is a tangible sign of our intention and resolve to work hard to do our best in our learning and everything else that we do. Therefore, Bridgnorth Endowed Sixth Formers are expected to dress, and act, in a smart and confident manner that is appropriate for a school work environment

Sixth Form students should wear their identity lanyard at all times when they are on school premises, to support the safeguarding of all students in our community.

### Boys

- Smart trousers (no denim or jean-style) or suit
- Smart collared shirt or polo shirt (tie optional)
- jumper, cardigan or waistcoat (optional) with no large logos or printed images
- Shoes in plain leather or imitation leather

### GIRLS

- Smart work style dress, skirt, or suit worn just above the knee, or longer, or;
- Smart style trouser (no denim or jean-style trousers). No leggings or jeggings
- A smart formal top, blouse/ shirt with a respectable neckline and no cut outs
- Jacket, cardigan or jumper (optional)
- Shoes/ boots in plain or imitation leather, with a heel of no more than 6cm

*Students taking part in P.E or recreational fitness activities should have appropriate clothes to wear before and after taking part in the activity please.*

### What not to wear

- No jeans, jeggings or leggings
- No hoodies (unless a Bridgnorth Endowed School Hoodie)
- No large printed logos
- No trainers
- Should not wear immodest or revealing clothes
- Piercings and jewellery should be discreet, no facial or tongue piercings or ear spacers
- Hair should not be extreme in style or colour

The overall effect of Sixth Form clothing should be one of smartness, and appropriateness within a school work environment. The School shall be the sole arbiter in respect of these requirements. Students who are unsure about the suitability of particular items of clothing should consult with the Head of Sixth Form before purchasing, or before wearing such items to school.
