



## **Response to the March 2026 Parent Survey**

Thank you to all parents and carers who took the time to complete our recent parent survey. We greatly appreciate both the very positive comments shared and the constructive feedback highlighting areas for development. Your views are extremely important to us and will directly inform our school development planning moving forward.

We are pleased that the survey reflects many areas of strength within our school. A strong majority of parents would recommend the school to others, and many of you told us that your children feel safe and happy at school. We are particularly encouraged by the positive responses relating to pupils' wellbeing, behaviour and the caring environment we strive to create every day.

Alongside these strengths, the survey has also helped us to identify clear areas where we know we can do better. In response, we are already taking action.

### **Communication with Home**

Communication with home was highlighted as an area for improvement. We are currently exploring new and improved methods of communication, particularly around homework, to make expectations clearer and to enable parents to better support learning at home. We are also reviewing our communication procedures more broadly to ensure that information is shared in a timely and consistent way. Importantly, we want to improve how often we communicate positive behaviour and successes so that parents hear more about what their children are doing well.

### **Support for Students**

Support for students is another key area of focus. From September, the opening of our new Specialist Resource Provision will allow us to provide enhanced support for students with special educational needs. Alongside this, we are also exploring ways to further challenge and stretch all learners so that every child can achieve their full potential. Staff receive weekly professional development for teaching and learning, including SEND-focused training, which directly informs classroom practice and ensures inclusive, high-quality teaching for all students.

### **Bullying and Relationships**

Feedback around bullying and relationships is taken very seriously. We will shortly be sharing our updated relational behaviour policy with parents. This policy places a strong emphasis on how we respond to concerns, including bullying, and how we work with students and families to resolve issues effectively. In addition, the introduction of new procedures around mobile phones in school is intended to improve safeguarding, reduce opportunities for online-related issues during the school day, and support student wellbeing.

Once again, thank you for your openness and engagement. Your feedback is invaluable in helping us reflect, improve and continue to develop as a school community. We look forward to working in partnership with you as we take these next steps.
